

HCFG Range Rules

Range rules are established for the protection of the club, its members and its neighbors. All club members are empowered and expected to enforce these rules if and when necessary and to report to the club's Board of Directors.

1. Alcohol is not allowed on the premises at any time for any reason. A violation of this rule will cause immediate expulsion for the club with NO right of appeal. Anyone suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, narcotics or medications which inhibit performance of judgment while on the premises of HCFG will not be permitted to stay.
2. Upon entering the club grounds, all members and guests must sign in. Guest must sign a release of liability.
3. Members are responsible for their guests. Any member found destroying club property will lose their membership.
4. Members must wear their membership card while on club property, and eye and ear protection while shooting.
5. No firing is permitted on club property before 8am and after 10pm, Sunday shooting starts at 12 noon so we can respect the local churches.
6. Absolutely no shooting on the property other than on designated ranges. The association is not a game preserve, hunting is not allowed on the property.
7. Full automatic firing and .50 BMG is absolutely forbidden on club property. Firearms capable of "select fire" may be used but ONLY in semi-automatic mode.
8. The firing line is immediately in front of several firing points. All ranges are measured from this firing line to the face of the target.
9. Each rifle firing point shall have a minimum width of five (5) feet. Each pistol firing point shall have a minimum width of four (4) feet.
10. The range must be cleaned up/and or repaired by each shooter upon the completion of shooting. Police the firing point for all brass and other trash, burn barrels for paper trash and buckets for spent brass are provided. (Make it personal policy to leave it better than you found it.)
11. Members (and their guests) are to provide their own targets and target stands. The materials in the clubhouse are for club shoots, but may be purchased at cost by the members. Metal targets/target stands are forbidden.
12. Parking below the clubhouse is to be well behind any firing point, and up to the board of directors as well as weather permitting.
13. The front gate should be locked behind each member, except for shoots where non-members are allowed to compete.
14. Any member (or their guest) witnessing the destruction of club property must report such actions to a board member. Try to be specific with details. I.e. names, dates, times, circumstances, car tags, if possible use a cell phone camera to document.
15. Any member (or their guest) using unsafe shooting practices will be automatically suspended from the club. This includes careless/unsafe handling of firearms as well as the prohibitions outlined herein. Any member so suspended must appear before the next scheduled board meeting and show good cause why they should be reinstated. Failure to appear will mean expulsion. The board reserves the right to dismiss anyone for good cause.
16. Before shooting members (and their guests) must install and raise the red range flag provided. The range flag indicates shooting is in progress. Once shooting has completed lower and return the flag to the clubhouse.
17. Ranges will be used on a first come, first serve basis at all times other than scheduled club shoots. Be courteous to other shooters and share range time. Shooter will show courtesy on the firing line by calling a cease fire of sufficient length as to allow new arrivals to place their targets.
